Established in 1962, the International Center for Advanced Mediterranean Agronomic Studies (CIHEAM) is an intergovernmental organization composed of 13 Member States (Albania, Algeria, Egypt, France, Greece, Italy, Lebanon, Malta, Morocco, Portugal, Tunisia, Türkiye, and Spain).


The Centre brings together 4 Mediterranean Institutes: CIHEAM Bari (Italy), CIHEAM Chania (Greece), CIHEAM Montpellier (France), CIHEAM Zaragoza (Spain), and a General Secretariat, headquarters of the organization, based in Paris (France).

The CIHEAM has a long history of multilateral and regional cooperation and offers education and training, research, technical assistance, and capacity building activities. It works with public administrations, universities, research centres, cooperation and development organizations, local authorities, civil society actors, and companies to meet the needs of Mediterranean populations and territories.

OUR HISTORY IN FEW LINES

Originally centered on the training of senior executives from Mediterranean countries, the CIHEAM quickly became a pioneer in the mobility of students and young researchers. A unique space that combines science and diplomacy, the CIHEAM has made the circulation of knowledge and skills a force at the service of the region's agri-food systems. This ambition was made possible thanks to the French Louis Malassis, who set up innovative teaching by installing, more than 40 years ago, the international system of Masters in the Institutes.

From the vision of two pioneers ...

The Spanish agronomist and diplomat, Ramón Esteruelas, for his part, saw in the Mediterranean not only a common civilization but also an area of cooperation with great potential. This vision was reinforced by the Italian Carlo Scarascia Mugnozza, former Commissioner for Agriculture of the European Union, who worked on an enlargement to the neighbors of the southern and eastern shores to respond to the Mediterranean challenges and bring out collective ambitions.

This vision, carried by avant-garde figures and consolidated by the commitment of many others, has made it possible, since the 1960s, to provide a basis for Mediterranean political dialogue and to make the food issue a priority in co-development.


Education and Training



Political dialogue, partnerships and scientific diplomacy

Over the past 62 years, CIHEAM has successfully created and maintained an atmosphere of trust and regional dialogue, allowing for the co-construction of solutions to the region's food and agricultural challenges. This ability to bring decision-makers together and establish favorable conditions for co-development is notably demonstrated by the regular meetings held with the ministers of its member states, in the presence of partners such as the Council of Europe and the OECD. Furthermore, CIHEAM has developed several strategic partnerships with international organizations, including the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization, the Union for the Mediterranean, the International Olive Council, the European Forest Institute, the Arab Organization for Agricultural Development, the Arab Water Council, Plan Bleu, the International Organisation of Vine and Wine...

CIHEAM MINISTERIAL MEETINGS

CIHEAM organized the first meeting of the Ministers of Agriculture of its thirteen member countries in 1999. The goal was to establish a lasting dialogue among Mediterranean countries on strategic issues related to agriculture, fisheries, food, and rural development, while promoting the adoption of a common approach. It manages the coordination of training, research, and cooperation activities among the Institutes






