homogeneous system to follow up with all the former students of CIHEAM. An interactive platform through which to maintain contacts, organize events, propose questionnaires and studies, search for professionalities, expertises, operators, private businesses, etc.

This is one of the main objectives of the CIHEAM, in particular of its Educational Group and it is one of the key objectives of the CIHEAM 2030 Strategic Plan. The CIHEAM (International Centre for Advanced Mediterranean Agronomic Studies) is a key intergovernmental organization in the Mediterranean region. Its mission is to promote cooperation and knowledge sharing in agriculture, food security, and rural development. At the heart of CIHEAM's work is its commitment to education and training through its four Mediterranean Agronomic Institutes (Bari, Italy - Chania, Greece - Montpellier, France - and Zaragoza, Spain).

Therefore, the role of the CIHEAM Alumni Network is multifaceted:

This signifies a move beyond a simple reunion towards a more strategic and solution-oriented event. The meeting is expected to produce tangible outcomes, such as:

- Collaborative proposals for research, development, or cooperation projects tackling specific issues like food security, climate change adaptation, sustainable agriculture in Lebanon.
- Reinforcement of institutional synergies by strengthening the partnership between CIHEAM, the Lebanese government, and other national and international actors.
- **A "call to action"** or a set of recommendations from the alumni community to guide future initiatives and investments in the Lebanese agri-food sector.

group of former students; it is a tool for CIHEAM to set its alumni strategy on the
