Context & Rationale:

Women across the MENA region are integral to food systems—serving as producers, processors, retailers, innovators, and knowledge holders. However, they face **entrenched structural barriers** that prevent their full participation in agro-food value chains. These include:

- Discriminatory access to land and financial services
- Poor representation in cooperative and decision-making structures
- Limited access to innovation ecosystems and agri-tech solutions
- Low integration into formal entrepreneurial support networks
- Gender-blind agricultural and food security policies

As Mediterranean countries face converging crises—climate volatility, food insecurity, youth unemployment—there is an urgent need to **recognize and unleash the potential of women-led innovation** to drive a sustainable transformation of agro-food systems.

Despite progress in national strategies and scattered regional initiatives, a coordinated and strategic policy framework that places women-led innovation at the heart of agro-food transformation remains absent.

The AECID-supported UfM Regional Agenda on Gender and Food Security aims to fill this gap by fostering inclusive policy development, building institutional capacity, and amplifying women's leadership. Within this framework, this Stakeholder Dialogue will convene diverse regional actors



to co-create a Regional Agenda on Innovation for Women Entrepreneurs in the Agro-Food Value Chain.

This agenda will serve as a policy and action-oriented roadmap that elevates women's contributions to innovation, improves their access to enabling ecosystems, and ensures they are fully integrated into efforts to build resilient, sustainable, and inclusive food systems across the Mediterranean.

This event, organized with the financial support of **AECID** and in collaboration with **CIHEAM**, **FAO-NENA Regional Office and American University in Cairo (AUC) Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation (CEI)** represents a key milestone in this process, strengthening both **capacity** (1,5 day training) and **regional dialogue** (half-day event) to co-create solutions for a more equitable agrofood future.

2. Training's objectives

Overall Objective

To empower women entrepreneurs with the tools, knowledge, and networks to innovate in agrofood systems and influence policy transformation.

Specific Objectives

- Strengthen entrepreneurial and innovation skills tailored to women in agri-food value chains.
- Share gender-sensitive technologies and climate-smart solutions applicable to small and medium enterprises.
- Build a network of change-makers across MENA focused on inclusive food systems.
- Launch a participatory stakeholder dialogue to shape a **Regional Innovation Agenda** for women in agro-food.

3. Participants



- 50 Women entrepreneurs and cooperative leaders from 7 UfM-Masar countries (Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Palestine, Tunisia)
- Incubators, researchers, civil society leaders
- Donor agencies and UN partners (FAO, UN Women, IFAD, etc.)
- Financial institutions and innovation hubs

Expected Outcomes:

- 50 women entrepreneurs trained in innovation-driven approaches in agro-food systems.
- Strengthened networks among regional actors supporting women's agrient entrepreneurship.
- Draft commitments and priorities for a Regional Innovation Agenda for Women Entrepreneurs.

Stakeholder Dialogue:

Shaping a Regional Agenda on Innovation for Women Entrepreneurs in the Agro-Food Value
Chain

1. Objectives of the Dialogue

Overall Objective:

To initiate a multi-stakeholder consultation process that informs the development and adoption of a Regional Agenda on Innovation for Women in Agro-Food Systems.

Specific Objectives:

- Identify priority areas and policy gaps affecting women entrepreneurs in agro-food innovation across the MENA region.
- Facilitate the exchange of experiences, good practices, and institutional commitments from countries and stakeholders.
- Co-create a draft set of regional priorities, guiding principles, and action tracks.
- Strengthen collaboration and policy coherence among regional actors, including governments, donors, private sector, academia, and civil society.



2. Key Themes for Dialogue

The dialogue will be structured around four thematic pillars:

- 1. **Inclusive Innovation Ecosystems**: Strengthening the participation of women in research, technology design, and adoption, including digital agriculture and climate-smart practices.
- 2. **Access to Finance and Infrastructure:** Addressing constraints related to gender-responsive financing, rural infrastructure, and scalable business support services.
- 3. **Enabling Policies and Institutions**: Improving policy coherence, regulatory frameworks, and institutional capacity to promote gender equality in food systems.
- 4. **Leadership and Collective Action**: Enhancing women's voice in governance, cooperatives, chambers of commerce, and regional innovation platforms.

3. Format and Structure

Duration: Half-day (approximately 4 hours)
Participants: ~80 key stakeholders, including:

- Women entrepreneurs and cooperative leaders
- Donor agencies and international organizations (AECID, FAO, IFAD, UfM, CIHEAM)
- Private sector actors (agribusinesses, incubators, financial institutions)
- Civil society and women's networks
- Academic institutions and think tanks

4. Expected Outputs

 A draft framework for a Regional Agenda on Innovation for Women in Agro-Food Value Chains.



- A summary report capturing stakeholder inputs, priorities, and commitments.
- Strengthened collaboration among stakeholders toward implementation of the UfM Gender and Food Security Agenda.
